


9-42 THE BROADWAY: 14 – 23 APRIL FACEBOOK POSTS

POST 1 - 14th April 2017

FACT: The developers would retain only one building in its entirety on the Broadway frontage and the façades of two more (outlined in blue). All the other buildings would be swept away.

Save Ealing's Centre believes that Ealing has become a playground for developers whose only investment in our town centre is financial.


